Antisemitism – Jewish Stereotypes of Enemy and Other

Manfred Levy showed in his lecture of February 4th, 2020 that antisemitic attitudes are still present on the German population. Anti-Jewish resentments never disappeared instead are by now well established in the public sphere. ""You Jew" od "Jew Action" still are part of daily abusive vocabulary in German School Yards.

Every das antisemitism, often enough leading to violent behavior, is not limited to right wing groups. It does belong to mainstream society as an aoinion or prejudice.

The lecturer presented motives, talked about causes, and spoke different developments: Different positions toward Israel and the notion of Antizionism as well as Muslim forms of Antisemitism.

Manfred Lewy works for the Jewish Museum in Frankfurt a.M. The lecture was presented in cooperation with the Fridtjof-Nansen Academy for Political Education Ingelheim.

News from the Michael-Sternheimer Forest

The ongoing work of our Society was interrupted by the Corona pandemic as well. Due to cancellation of all air traffic Klaus Dürsch wasn't able to return from his Israel visit. That led to an opportunity to visit the Michael Stemheimer Forest in the Carmel Mountain Range.

A signed "Healthy life Path" begins at the "Carmel Forest Spa Resort." Ronit Arazi, the sister of Michael Stemheimer, contacted the local ranger and the Forest Fire Brigade to show me the place. What a surprising development: 1500 year old terraces have been restaured an replanted with native fruit trees. We were able to harvest mulberries and laurel leaves. Political Situation before the elections in Israel

Torsten Seibold is the European representative of "Givat Haviva" – the national education center of the Kibbutz Federation in promoting reconciliation between Jews and Arabs. Givat Haviva is the oldest and largest institution dedicated to the work of Jewish-Arab understanding.

Seibold gave a lecture on Wednesday, March 11th 2020. He talked about the domestic situation and foreign policy of Israel after the election as well as the consequences for Jewish Arab relationship in Israel. Visit at the Jewish Cemetery: Day of Public Viewing of Monuments

On the Day of Public Viewing of Monuments, Sept. 13th, 2020, the DIF invited to follow Klaus Dürsch on his way to present the Jewish Cemetery of Ingelheim. The theme for 2020 was "Under the Sign of Sustainability": Because of the Corona restrictions our reports could only be viewed on-line.

For example one contribution presented a guided tour tracing the life of Renate Wertheim Ingelheim: Imagine a 4 year old Renate in 1939. Her grandmother, 65 vears old Sophie Oppenheimer, would take her by her hand, and they would go visit the graves of their ancestors. What would they see on the Jewish cemetery in the Hugo-Loersch-Straße? Perhaps the grave of their oldest forefather, Veit Hirsch, from 1844?

They are back again ...

We had to return to the Renate-Wertheim-Platz on October 3rd, 2020 to protect our town from racist movements. The fate of Renate Wertheim serves as a warning. Therefore we gather on this place and guard it whenever racism shows its ugly head in our town.

We were again supported by the Anti-Racism Society of the SMG, the IGS Ingelheim and the Animal Farm of a Children- and Youth Club. On October 3rd 2020, the National Day of German Unity, the Anti-Democratic Right had again a permit to march. Whenever that happens, the number of guardians of the Renate-Wertheim-Platz increases. You could feel, that many, including young people and their teachers, act when democracy is in danger



Cleaning the "stumbling stones" (Stolpersteine)

The "Stumbling stones" were cleaned on Saturday, November 3rd 2020. We couldn't assemble a cleaning crew so "InRage" organized an on-line partnership. Whoever wanted to clean the stones could sign a doodle list. It worked. The photomontage below shows many ideas our participants had. Many thanks!

Ceremony to commemorate the November pogroms of November 9th/10th, 1938
